






If we want addiction destigmatized, we need a language that's unified.

- FY 2022 budget includes \$131.8B in discretionary funds and \$1.5T in mandatory funding.



The purpose of this notice is to solicit applications for three funding opportunities: The National Infrastructure Project Assistance grants program (Mega), the Nationally Significant Multimodal Freight and Highways Projects grants program (INFRA), and the Rural Surface Transportation Grant program (Rural). While applicants can choose to apply for only one grant program, this combined solicitation will allow applicants to apply for two, or all three of these funding opportunities by submitting only one application.
